Martina's research focuses on the intersectionality of suicidality, personality dimensions, and transdiagnostic modularized treatments in order to better understand shared personality-based mechanisms that maintain psychological symptoms and suicidal thoughts and behaviors. Martina aims to improve and expand current transdiagnostic treatments that target these symptoms and built upon them so she can tailor suicide-specific treatments for individuals based on personality. She is a Member-at-Large for APAGS and a Co-Leader of ABCT's Suicide and Self Injury Special Interest Group (SSI SIG). Martina's mission within KPAGS and APAGS is to build inclusivity and diversity in scientific fields, especially for individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds (e.g., low SES, first-gen).
