Dr. William W. Stoops, a Professor in the Departments of Behavioral Science, Psychiatry and Psychology at the University of Kentucky, earned his Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Davidson College in Davidson, NC, and his Master's degree and Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of Kentucky. His research evaluates the behavioral and pharmacological factors that contribute to drug use disorders, focusing primarily on cocaine. Dr. Stoops' research contributions resulted in receipt of the 2016 Psychologist of the Year Award from the Kentucky Psychological Association, the 2013 Joseph Cochin Young Investigator Award from the College on Problems of Drug Dependence, and the 2008 Wyeth Young Psychopharmacologist Award from Division 28 (Psychopharmacology and Substance Abuse) of the American Psychological Association (APA). Dr. Stoops serves on the APA Advocacy Coordinating Committee and is the APA Division 28 Council Representative. He is also the President-Elect of the College on Problems of Drug Dependence Board of Directors and is Editor of *Experimental and Clinical Psychopharmacology*.
